## **Experience the Moment with God**

We love to compare. We compare our facial features to those of other family members. We compare our likes and dislikes of food and the style of our clothes. We even compare our athletic moves with others. Have you ever met someone who was so unique that no one could compare to them?

Maybe your first thought takes you to a make-believe superhero. No one is like Superman. No one is like Batman. Maybe you start thinking about iconic athletes like Michael Jordan, David Robinson, or even Mickey Mantle. Maybe you start thinking about influential people like Abraham Lincoln, Martin Luther King Jr., or Joan of Arc. ### **Experience the Moment with God**

Families can spend hours imaging what could be out of the wet sand. Unfortunately, for every sandcastle built, there is a wave destined to destroy it. God created, and his creation has not been destroyed by the waves of time. Yes, Jesus is the only one who created a system of life that is far beyond our comprehension but well within our knowledge.

### **Experience the Moment with God**

Have you ever experienced déjà vu? A moment in the present that has an extremely familiar feeling—like you've experienced it before. Maybe you had a dream that came true, or you met someone that you felt like you had met before. It's fitting that the French phrase means "already seen."

If you read the Old Testament, there are many "already seen" moments like this when it comes to Jesus. From Genesis 1:26 when God says, "Let us make man," to Daniel 3 when there is a miraculous fourth man in the fire with Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego. The Bible tells of many experiences where God appears in human form—Jesus. Consider who Jacob wrestled with before his name changed to Israel (Genesis 32:22-32). Or the many references to an "angel" speaking with and engaging humanity in such a way that one would easily see the pre-incarnate Christ interacting with his creation. Truly, to cross reference all the Old Testament passages with Jesus would look like the root system of a grass field. Ignatius of Antioch says it like this, "There is one physician, who is both flesh and spirit, born and yet not born, God in humanity, true life in death, both of Mary and of God, first passible and then impassible, Jesus Christ our Lord (Turkey/c.50-c.117)." Jesus is the only one who has ever appeared to humanity before he was born.

### **Experience God through Prayer**

Jesus, thank you for appearing in my life so many times even before I knew you.

### **Experience the Moment with God**

The gospel stories of Jesus are amazing! From his birth, life, death, and resurrection, we gain examples of how to live and how to connect with God. Jesus performed amazing feats, touching thousands of lives during his earthly ministry—that number would be in the trillions today.

What if I told you that his whole miraculous life was described in the Old Testament. If you read the Old Testament narrative, you will start to see many connections. Jesus fulfills God's promise to Abraham, atoning for humanity's separation. He fulfills every law given through Moses. He is a direct descendant of David, thus fulfilling God's promise to David of having a king on the throne forever. He was born of the virgin that Isaiah spoke of in chapter 7. He escorts us from darkness to light as was foretold by Isaiah in chapter 9. He would suffer for our sins as Isaiah proclaims in chapter 53. He establishes the new covenant of Jeremiah's vision in chapter 31. The list goes on and on. Jesus is the only one that the law and prophets point too from the Old Testament.

### **Experiencing God through Practice**

Get to know the work of Jesus, as described before his birth, by reading Old Testament scripture and their New Testament counterparts. Jesus fulfilled a minimum of 300 prophecies from the Old Testament<sup>1</sup>. Statistically there is a 1 in 10^17 chance that someone could fulfill all the prophecies. How incredible that Jesus truly did come and fulfill every single one! Take a few minutes to read through some of these prophecies:

- Genesis 3:14-15 and Hebrews 2:14 he will defeat Satan
- Psalm 2:1-2 and Matthew 12:14 the leaders will conspire against him
- Psalm 2:7 and Matthew 3:17 God declares Jesus is his son
- Psalm 41:9 and Mark 14:10-11- he will be betrayed
- Isaiah 50:6 and Matthew 26:67/Matthew 27:26-30 he will be beaten and spit upon

### **Experience the Moment with God**

There are many mysterious things within the world we live in. Not everything seems to be defined easily through logic, science, or math. The same could be said about theology. Especially when trying to define the nature of Jesus Christ. It wasn't until the Council of Chalcedon in 433 A.D. that both the divinity and humanity of Jesus was fully defined and accepted.

A Latin phrase, not used much in the modern world, was used to explain the mystery of Jesus. The phrase, "Communicatio Idiomatum," means communication of properties. What this clarifies is that Jesus is the only one who can be fully God while also being fully man. As man, he understands our struggles, he can fully relate to our suffering. As God, he is fully in control of our struggles, and he can fully restore us during our suffering. Though these natures are distinct, they are in perfect communication to each other enabling Jesus to be the only one who can be born of the virgin Mary and be the only who has always been. Jesus is the only God who took on mortality so that we can experience full redemption.

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### **Experience the Moment with God**

Have you ever been awed by the authority of a drill sergeant? He speaks, and the whole unit moves. Think about the authority held by heads of state. Their words shape economies, start and end wars, and form laws that govern societies. The words of powerful people have impact.

But think about this, when Jesus spoke all creation was formed. When he gave a command, it was for the dead to rise. His impact wasn't momentary, it's eternal. This is authority. The word used in the original biblical language literally means, "out of being." It is out of who Jesus is, that his authority lies. Is there an area in your life, in which you need his authority? Jesus is the only one who can speak with authority to truly change your life.

## **Experience God through Prayer**

Jesus, speak to my life. Let my situation, under in your authority, bring honor to your name.

### Read Exodus 3:1-15

- Who is in this passage? What are some important themes?
- Why would God speak to Moses in this way?

### **Experience the Moment with God**

Death and disease are two of the most painful experiences humans can face in a lifetime. The death of a loved one brings great grief. Seeing a loved one suffer from disease can be demoralizing, and often brings with it anxiety, fear, and anger. Death and disease don't just steal life, they steal hope.

Yet, in his ministry, Jesus demonstrated his authority over death and disease. He rebuked the blindness from Bartimaeus' eyes (Mark 10) and in an instant, the man who had been born blind saw color and light and began to follow Jesus. In his grief, Jesus rebuked the curse of death and changed history with the words to his friend, "Lazarus, come out." (John 11:44) Jesus is the only one who can rebuke disease and death into submission. Only in the name of Jesus, and under his authority and will, can we speak hope in the face of death, and healing in the wake of disease.

## **Experience God through Prayer**

Jesus, speak hope and healing to my heart and rebuke death and disease from my life and in the lives of my family and friends.

### **Experience God through His Word**

### Read Mark 10:46-52

- · What phrases stand out to you as you read this passage?
- Why would Jesus decide to heal Bartimaeus?
- · How does this reveal the nature of Jesus?

#### Read John 11:17-44

- Who are the people in the story?
- · What words and phrases stand out?
- · How does Jesus view death?

- How does this passage encourage us when facing death and disease?

### **Experiencing God through Practice**

In Exodus 15:26, God reveals himself as Jehovah Rapha, which is Hebrew for "The Lord who heals." God is willing to heal. Our role is to call on his name and invite him into the situation. This week, call on God to provide physical and emotional healing to people in need.

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- 3. Share a moment from this past week that you are thankful for.

### **Experience the Moment with God**

It is safe to say that the United States has one of the best criminal justice systems in the world. We have rights that cannot be violated, we are innocent until proven guilty, and everyone convicted must be done so beyond a reasonable doubt, and even then, verdicts can be appealed. One could say that this system is iron clad. Yet, even with all these checks and balances, there are moments when innocent people get convicted of a crime they did not commit.

Wrongful incarceration may be common, but it's rare to find a person who would voluntarily go to prison on behalf of someone else. Yet, this the very story of Jesus. Jesus was not just an innocent man wrongfully accused. He was the only one to live a sinless life. He owed death no debt, yet he gave his life to pay our debt. He was willingly crucified and faced the death of a common criminal to pay the ransom for our sin. But death did not understand that it had no hold on Jesus, on the third day he was resurrected! Ephesians 4:8-9 explains that Jesus descended into the depths of the prison of death. Because he was the only one who was sinless, Jesus owed death no debt and therefore his sacrifice defeated the sting of death for us all. Jesus is the only one who could live a sinless life, die a sinner's death, and still be perfectly justified.

### **Experience God through Prayer**

Thank you, Jesus, for living a perfect life that broke the hold of death.

#### Read Isaiah 53

### **Experience the Moment with God**

American illusionist Harry Houdini was known for his death-defying acts. He wowed millions of people all around the world with his escapes. At the height of his fame, many people saw him as invincible. Though he escaped chains, boxes, and ropes, in the end he would not escape the grip of death. One of his own stunts would take his life. He would die a great illusionist but never a savior.

The same is not true for Jesus. He spent his life giving to others. He did not woo crowds with illusions; he healed them with his words. He did not trick people with antics; he filled their minds with the truth. Though he died and was buried, on the third day he rose again. He didn't escape death. Jesus is the only one to defeat his own death.

Jesus, only you can defeat death! I pray that you keep me until the resurrection.

### **Experiencing God through Practice**

Jesus does what we cannot do, he defeats his own death. Romans 6:23 says that the "wages of sin is death" and since Romans 3:23 declares that "all of sinned," naturally we would all have to die. But because Jesus is God, his death overcomes death for us all. Because he lives, we have life. This is the heartbeat of the Gospel. Make a list of 5 people who needs to hear this message.
